

EPA Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program

EPA's Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program requires suppliers of fossil fuels or industrial GHGs, manufacturers of vehicles and engines, and facilities that emit 25,000 metric tons or more per year of GHG emissions to submit annual reports to EPA. **These reports are directly submitted to EPA, not to KDHE.** For more information about the rule follow this link: <http://www.epa.gov/climatechange/emissions/ghgrulemaking.html>.

EPA intends to extend this year's reporting deadline – originally March 31 – and plans to have the final electronic reporting tool available in late summer. This extension will allow EPA to further test the system that reporters will use to submit data, and give industry the opportunity to test the tool, provide feedback and have sufficient time to become familiar with it prior to reporting.

The agency will provide more detail on the intended changes in the coming weeks and will ensure that this reporting extension is in effect before the original reporting deadline of March 31, 2011.

In order to collect the emissions electronically EPA has developed the electronic Greenhouse Gas Reporting tool (e-GGRT) which is now available to support user and facility registration under EPA's Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program.

Facilities and suppliers under the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program must use e-GGRT to submit a Certificate of Representation to EPA by January 30, 2011. Reporters should allow at least ten days for their registrations to be processed by EPA. EPA requires each e-GGRT user to print, sign and mail-in an Electronic Signature Agreement.

Please note that Suppliers of Coal-based Liquid Fuels (subpart LL) and Suppliers of Petroleum Products (subpart MM) will follow OTAQ procedures, not e-GGRT, to register and to report GHG data for those subparts.
