Local Government Outdoor Recreation Grant Program (LGORGP)

Don't Forget this Program!

FACTS:

- State funded grant
- 50/50 match
- Hard cash match only
- \$500,000 in FY 2001
- Projects must be ADA compliant
- Projects must be completed within one year

APPROVED

PROJECTS:

- New and improved playgrounds
- Swimming pools
- Restrooms and Shelters
- Ball fields
- Skate parks

LGORGP Application Process

- Applications due September 1st in FY
- 2 copies must be submitted
- Applications must include:
 - Detailed cost breakdown
 - Local funding statement
 - Site plan and photos
 - EEO and ADA compliance statements
 - Applicant's 5 year plan
 - Relation of project to KDWP strategic plan

LGORGP Approval

- Applications reviewed and scored by Statewide Advisory Committee
 - Proposals which improve handicap accessibility and reduce environmental impacts have priority
- Chosen applications approved by KDWP Commission
- Final approval made by KDWP Secretary

National Recreational Trails Fund (NRTF)

FACTS:

- Federally funded grant
- 80/20 match
- In-kind services allowed for match
- ADA compliance depends on type of trail
- Projects completion can be extended for three years but prefer one year completion
- Trails must be strictly intended for recreational use

APPROVED PROJECTS:

- Nature trails
- Multi-use trails
- Equestrian trails
- ORV trails
- Trail improvements
- Trail amenities
 - Bridges
 - Restrooms
 - Campsites
 - Signs
 - Brochures
 - Equipment

NRTF Application Process

- Applications due August 1st in FY
- 2 copies must be submitted
- Applications must include:
 - Detailed cost breakdown (so important)
 - Narrative of project and why you are doing it
 - Local funding statement
 - Environmental review checklist
 - Site plan and photos
 - EEO and ADA compliance statements
 - Applicant's 5 year plan
 - Relation of project to KDWP strategic plan
 - If you do not have a complete application you will be placed on lower priority

NRTF Approval

- Applications scored by Statewide Trails Advisory Committee
- Chosen projects approved by Federal Highway Administration

NRTF Reimbursement Process

- **Once Work Begins:**
 - All contracts are signed first
 - Document ALL equipment, and volunteer force labor hours spent on trail construction
 - List bills and total in-kind expenditures on Project Billing Form
 - Submit billing form and copies of all invoices to KDWP
 - KDWP sends reimbursement request to Federal Highway Administration
 - When project is complete, submit the Post Construction Certificate

Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF)

FACTS:

- Much like the NRTF
- Federally funded grant
- 50/50 match
- In-kind services allowed for match
- Requires a 6(f) boundary
- Requires site inspections

APPROVED PROJECTS:

- Acquisition of land
- Swimming pools
- Park development
- Ball fields
- Playgrounds
- Facility renovation

LWCF Application Process

- Applications due April 1st in FY (if funding is available)
- 2 copies must be submitted
- Applications must include:
 - 5 year comprehensive park/recreation plan
 - Relation of project to KDWP strategic plan
 - Cost breakdown
 - Willingness to sell form (for acquisition)
 - EEO and ADA compliance forms
 - Local funding statement
 - Environmental review checklist
 - Site plan and photos
 - Public support documentation

LWCF Approval

- Projects scored by statewide advisory committee
- Approved projects submitted to National Park Service for final approval

LWCF Reimbursement Process

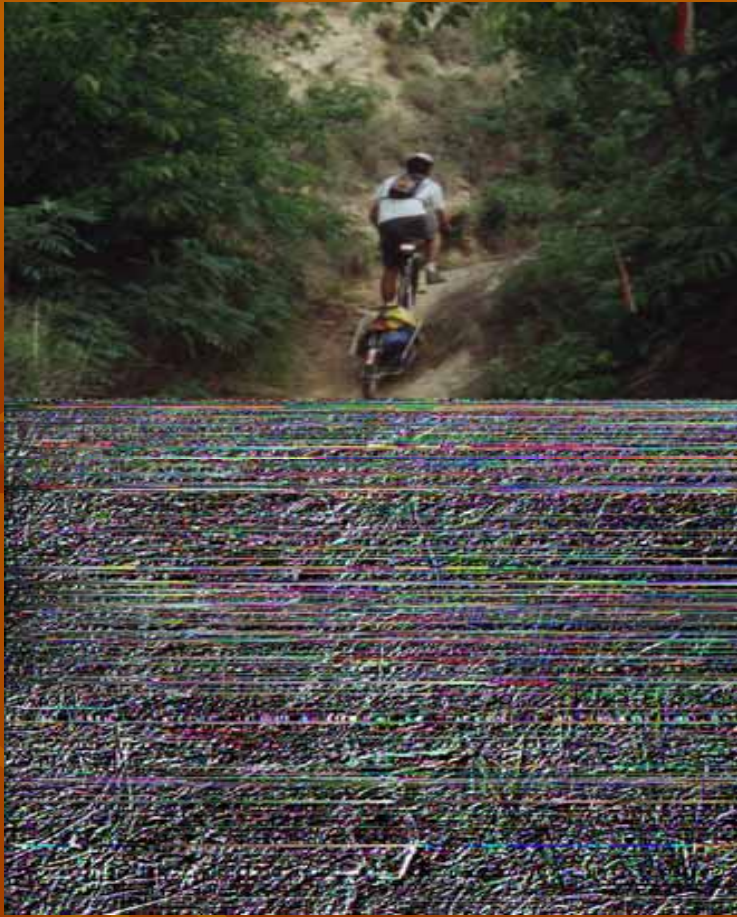
- Identical to NRTF reimbursement process

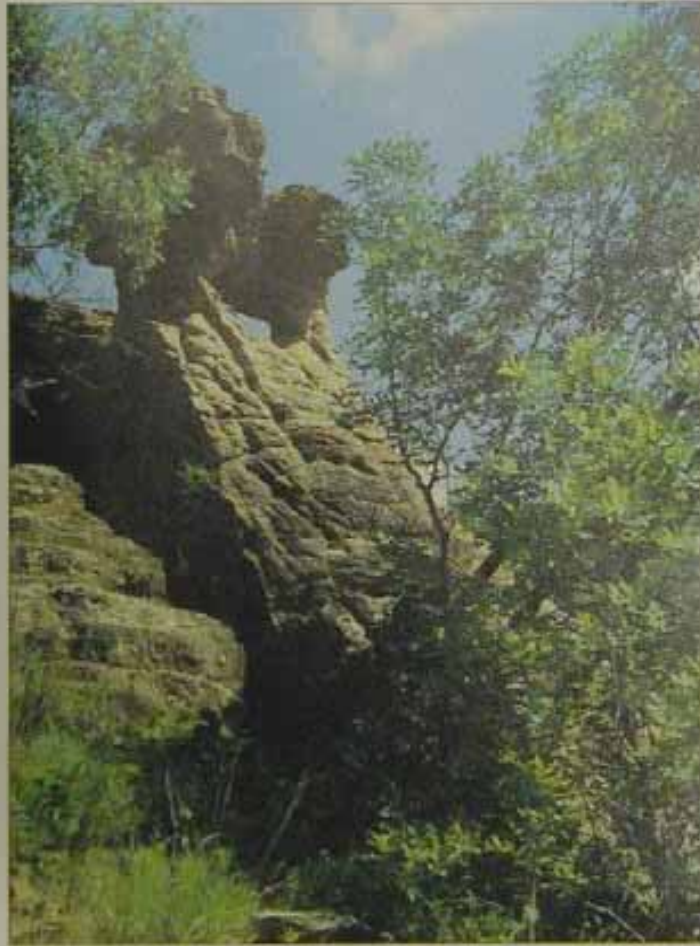

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POST CONSTRUCTION CERTIFICATE

Instructions

This certificate must be submitted with the final billing. The form is signed by the mayor, commission chairman, or board president and the architect or engineer who supervised the construction. If the project did not involve a consulting architect or engineers, the sponsor's engineer should inspect the project and sign the form.

As-Built

If deviations in design or site location were made from the plans previously submitted to the Department of Wildlife and Parks, as-built plans must accompany this form. As-built plans must include:

- a) site plan showing the location of the project area and facilities,
- b) elevations and floor plans of structures.

Two copies of as-built plans are to be submitted. The project sponsor must record one set of plans which identifies the work done with federal funds at the park, at both the Town Hall and County Courthouse.
