2. Update from Immunization Program
  - a. Program Area 1: Interoperability
    - i. We have finalized a provider survey that has been launched on SurveyMonkey.
    - ii. This survey captures information on provider EHR systems.
    - iii. The survey results will be analyzed and used to select providers to develop interfaces between their respective EHRs and KSWebIZ.
  - b. Program Area 2: Vaccine Ordering Module
    - i. We received KITO approval to proceed with this project.
    - ii. The objective is to develop a vaccine ordering module that will interface with the CDC Vaccine Ordering System, VTrckS
    - iii. Envision has submitted the first deliverable – a detailed interface document. KDHE has approved the document and work will now begin to implement the changes to the interface document.
  - c. Program Area 3: Projects to Improve Reimbursement in Public Health Department Clinics
    - i. Kansas Foundation for Medical care is conducting a LHD immunization billing survey.
    - ii. The survey tool was pilot tested with modifications incorporated to the tool.

iii. The billing survey was distributed on 1/18/2012 with 36% of LHDs responding.

iv. Stakeholders have been identified and convened quarterly.

d. Program Area 6: School Located Vaccination Clinics

i. The Kansas Immunization Program offered all local health departments the opportunity to apply for funding school located vaccination clinics. Ten counties were awarded funding to provide vaccination services.

ii. Each county will decide which schools will be targeted.

iii. The Kansas Immunization Program has also, through the PPHF Grant for Program Area 1, purchased a provider tracking database tool that will maintain all data on all providers and users in KSWebIZ. A UAT was set up and registry staff has been testing the system. The vendor will be at KDHE for an on-site visit in February.

3. BCHS Update

a. Enrolling Local Health Departments:

i. 305 out 312 completed enrollment process and have received a token.

ii. 5 need to still need to register in KANPHIX

iii. 2 still waiting on paperwork to be turned in.

iv. 2 counties waiting on all paperwork and registering on KANPHIX

b. CRA work plan guidance Task #7

On January 10, 2012 Emily Nickel sent out the PHEP 2011-2012 Local Work Plan Task # 7 Guidance.

A. *LHDs will update plan to include language regarding the utilization of KS-CRA for inventory management and tracking, based upon formalized guidance released by KDHE.*

- KDHE encourages health departments to begin using the Kansas Countermeasure Response Administration (KS-CRA) system as their primary inventory management system, based on 2011 availability. Other systems and methods may be kept as a backup. To meet this deliverable, add CRA language and submit a copy of this language to KDHE [btgrantreports@kdheks.gov](mailto:btgrantreports@kdheks.gov). For sample language, please see the attached document *“Inventory Management System Language 2011.”* This is also available at: [http://www.kdheks.gov/cphp/operating\\_guides.htm](http://www.kdheks.gov/cphp/operating_guides.htm) It is recommended to copy and paste into the Mass Dispensing (MD) SOG under the Inventory Management System (IMS) section. You are NOT required to resubmit your entire Mass Dispensing Standard Operating Guide during 2011-2012 as these are already on file by KDHE. To meet the 2011-2012 grant requirements you ONLY have to submit any new supplemental documents or language revisions.
- B. LHDs will ensure inventory information is loaded and updated within the system, based on KDHE-developed guidance.*
- KDHE will be contacting facilities individually during March-August 2012 regarding opportunities to utilize CRA for supply management. This will be accomplished in coordination with work plan item #9 to verify accuracy of primary and back-up delivery locations in CRA. Based on local input, local health departments are no longer required to use PHARMFINDER as this information will be managed through CRA. #### 4. Envision Update

- a. On January 05, 2012 an updated LDS enhancement was sent to Envision for an estimate. Envision advised they will respond by the end of the week with a time and cost estimate.
- b. The LDS fields will be added to the Inventory Location Module in CRA.
- c. Inventory Lot AutoSum function - a fix on the system to have the inventories with the same lot do self sums upon accepting transfers. Brittany indicated vaccine did this on their end and they no long have multiple rows of the same inventories. See jpg example: Inventory Lot AutoSum Example.
