KDHE announces second public availability session for former American Cleaners groundwater contamination

TOPEKA, Kan. – The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) announces a second public availability session scheduled for **6 p.m. on Thursday, September 7, at the former Alternative Haysville High School located at 106 Stewart Avenue, Haysville, Kan.**

The KDHE Dry Cleaner Remediation Program will be available at 6 p.m. to update residents on the contamination attributed to the Former American Cleaners site at 412 West Grand Avenue. The update will include a discussion on the current impacts to domestic wells due to contamination from dry-cleaning related chlorinated solvents in the area of concern, as well as plans to provide long-term alternative drinking water supplies to impacted areas. After the update, KDHE will facilitate a question and answer session to clarify any outstanding concerns that residents may have.
