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## KSFHP STRATEGIC PLANNING MEETING



KSFHP Advisory Council and staff conducted their annual strategic planning session in Wichita, KS, on October 11, 2016. The day-long session provided staff and council members an opportunity to share ideas, review reports, discuss quality improvement/assurance measures, build consensus for new initiatives and develop the 2017 KSFHP Strategic Plan. Strategic Plan goals include to maintain and expand provider communication, increase and develop community partner collaboration, expand health education and client communication, and improve quality assurance/improvement processes and procedures. In addition,

new strategies for the upcoming year included to update provider agreements and streamline database tracking, provide education materials on tetanus and other immunizations and ensure uniform program procedures throughout the state.

## TOBACCO CESSATION

KSFHP can cover 4-sessions of tobacco cessation counseling and FDA approved medications for up to 90-days. Any future counseling sessions and medications beyond 90-days will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. For more information, please contact your Regional Case Manager.

In addition, in case you were unable to attend the Kansas Public Health Association conference in September 2016, Dr. Edward Ellerbeck from KU Medical Center, Preventative Medicine and Public Health, stated that "tobacco cessation should be more advice on how to quit (pharmacy, etc.) and less motivational interviewing." Lastly, we have listed CPT and ICD 10 codes below for your reference.

### (1) Patients with tobacco-related illness (treatment)

**99406:** 3-10 minutes of counseling\* (RVU 0.40); **99407:** >10 minutes of counseling\* (RVU 0.78).

### (2) Asymptomatic patients (prevention)

**G0436:** 3-10 minutes of counseling\* (RVU 0.40); **G0437:** >10 minutes of counseling\* (RVU 0.78).

\*ICD 10 F17.200 Nicotine dependence.

## KSFHP REGISTRATION RENEWALS

It's that time of year again to renew and send in family registration forms. KSFHP is requesting that access points submit completed registration forms to our office or their Regional Case Manager.

Starting in year 2016, the Human Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) is now requiring centers to report and collect client sexual orientation and gender identity (SO/GI). KSFHP has updated the client registration form to include a section for this data to be completed, please see page 2. Also, if you would like more information and training in collecting SO/GI, please view the [WEBINAR](#) presented by the National LGBT Health Education Center, a program of the Fenway Institute.

Also, KSFHP can now accept self employed clients. As a part of the registration process, please request a copy of the clients tax return to verify their adjusted gross income.
