KSFHP Mission


Kansas Statewide Farmworker Health Program (KSFHP) works to provide comprehensive primary care services to address the unique health care needs of migrant and seasonal farmworkers and their families.





KSFHP Vision

Healthy, happy and productive farmworkers and dependents in Kansas.



MISSION - To Protect and Improve the Health and Environment of all Kansans



KSFHP Funding

KSFHP is supported primarily through a grant to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) through the U.S. Health and Human Services, Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC). KSFHP also receives state primary care funding. Since 1994 KSFHP has been a voucher/case manager model based on PIN 94-7- Migrant Health Voucher Guidance.

KSFHP is 1 of 18 voucher programs of the total 166 MHCs in the nation. It is 1 of 3 statewide voucher programs.

Who is Eligible?

1. Agricultural work within the last two years making up a significant portion of a permanent job or as a full-time seasonal job.
 - Agriculture worker cannot be self-employed
2. 200% of poverty and under

Primary Care Services

- **Preventive and primary care visits**—KSFHP will assist with medical visits. A portion of prenatal care visits, labs and one sonogram are covered at Medicaid rate. Clients pay fee to providers at each visit.
- **Mental Health**—A visit for prevention, evaluation and/or treatment of a mental health issue or disorder, paid at Medicaid rate.
- **Substance Abuse**—A visit for alcohol or drug abuse services, including assessment and diagnosis, treatment or aftercare, paid at Medicaid rate.
- **Dental**—KSFHP covers 100% of dental services, up to a total of \$300 per year per client. Each client is responsible for \$10.00 fee per visit to be applied to his/her bill.

Primary Care Services (Cont'd)

- **Vision Care**—A visit for a comprehensive eye exam performed for the purpose of early detection, care, treatment and prevention. Paid at Medicaid rate. Eyeglasses or corrective lenses are not paid by KSFHP.
- **Pharmacy**—Up to \$150/year per person, up to \$300 for people with diabetes and/or hypertension. Each voucher is limited to \$50. Clients pay a \$5 fee per prescription.
- **Laboratory and X-Ray**—Paid at Medicaid rate. All procedures over \$150 must be preauthorized by regional case manager.

KSFHP Limitations

Program does not cover hospitalization, emergency room visits, or extensive diagnostic testing or treatment.

KSFHP Voucher Procedures

1. An eligible farmworker family fills out a registration at an access point agency or through a Regional Case Manager or Health Promoter and receives vouchers for health visits there. (Access points are listed in KSFHP brochure.)
2. If the client has an appointment at the access point, the access point staff write up the voucher to accompany the appointment.
3. If the client has an appointment at a clinic other than an access point, at a hospital, or has a prescription to retrieve from the pharmacy, then the client takes the voucher with him/her to the health visit, hospital, or pharmacy. The provider returns a copy of the voucher along with their bill to the KSFHP for reimbursement.

KSFHP Voucher Procedures (Cont'd)

4. For specialized care, an access point or provider must call the Regional Case Manager assigned to their area for approval. (Case management regions are listed in KSFHP brochure.)
5. Farmworker funds are supplemental and are only available to pay for services not covered by any other private or public program for which the individual is eligible.



TB Program Services

- Eligibility requires income of 200% of poverty or below, uninsured, and positive TB screening test—open to non-farmworkers.
- Program covers entire state with exception of Sedgwick, Shawnee, Ford, Finney, Saline, Wyandotte and Johnson Counties (they receive funds directly from state).
- Covers additional diagnostic and therapeutic services related to positive TB skin test, such as chest x-rays, office visits, hepatic enzymes, etc.



TB Program Services (Cont'd)

- Does not cover TB medicine or TB-related hospitalization
- Does not cover if patient is asymptomatic and TB testing is because of work, school or adjustment of immigration status



Coordination of Care

- KSFHP enabling staff works with wide range of providers and programs
- When assistance is not available through KSFHP, staff look to other programs or charitable care
- When other programs are not available staff help negotiate fee adjustment and payment plans





 - 83% were under 150%






There are Agriculture Workers in Almost Every County





ARE YOUR BILLS SUBMITTED?

Please notify billing personnel to submit bills promptly after service to facilitate timely payment.

KSFHP is now accepting bills with a date of service of **December 1, 2014** and after. Also, TB services that occurred on **July 1, 2014** or after should be submitted at this time.

Payments for services before **July 1, 2015** will be slightly delayed. This is because payments for services that occurred in the previous state fiscal year have more steps involved. For this reason, we strongly encourage clinics to submit bills in a timely manner in order to ensure a prompt payment.

All bills need to include both CPT codes and ICD 9 or ICD 10 codes. Please include the voucher when submitting the claim. If possible, please include a print-out of the patient summary from the appointment with the claim as well.

2015 FEDERAL REVIEW COMPLETED

On April 7-9, 2015, the Kansas Statewide Farmworker Health Program received its federal review from the Department of Health and Human Service's, Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC). BPHC funds Community Health Centers in designated medically underserved populations/areas to ensure vulnerable people receive the health care they need.

The federal review categories include Need, Services, Management and Finance, and Governance. According to the reviewers, KSFHP is doing an 'outstanding job.'

We learned quite a bit over the three days with the federal reviewers and are pleased with the knowledge and expertise they provided us. Some of the areas we need to improve include our sliding fee scale policy, data collection, and the addition of some new groups of individuals to be served through the voucher program.
