



Kansas Health Matters iPad Giveaway

In addition, Kansas Health Matters would like to increase the number of Kansas Promising Practices featured on the Kansas Health Matters Web site. Kansas Promising Practices will be shared with similar Web sites through the Healthy Communities Institute's database of promising practices.

The Promising Practices database provides a collection of programs, practices and policies aimed at improving community health and quality of life. The database provides carefully reviewed, documented and ranked practices that range from good ideas to evidence-based practices.

To Enter: If you'd like to submit a promising practice and enter the iPad Giveaway, please review our [Guidelines for Submitting Promising Practices](#) and then complete the [Promising Practice Submission Form](#). Upon submission of your promising practice, research staff at the Healthy Communities Institute will review it for inclusion in our database. If it meets criteria, it will be posted to all community sites. If it does not meet HCI criteria, Kansas Health Matters will make a final determination about including the program on our Web site. Either way, you will be entered for the iPad Giveaway.

Rules: Individuals or organizations may enter. Your name or organization will be entered for each promising practice that is submitted, so please enter all your promising practices. Individuals and partner organizations of the Kansas Partnership for Improving Community Health are not eligible.

Deadline for Entry: Individuals or organizations should enter their promising practices from July 22, 2013 through Sept. 13, 2013. A drawing of all entries will take place at the Kansas Public Health Association conference on Sept. 18-19 in Wichita. You do not need to be present to win.
