Status of American Indian/Alaska Native Population, Death, and Birth in Kansas, 2011-2015

Population

An estimated **61,363** American Indians/Alaska Natives (Al/AN) live in Kansas, making up about **2.1 percent** of the people in the state¹. This number is based on a count of people who report Al/AN alone or combined with one or more races.

Death

In 2011-2015, over 2,000 Al/AN deaths occurred. Al/AN die at a younger age on average (age 68 for Al/AN compared to age 76 for Whites). Al/AN males died, on average, 7 years earlier than White males (age 66 compared to age 73 respectively). Al/AN females died, on average, 8 years earlier than White females (age 71 compared to age 79 respectively).



1 in 3 Al/AN* deaths (33.2%) are related to commercial tobacco.

Tobacco-related deaths are highest among Al/AN* males (37.8%).

Tobacco-related deaths are significantly higher among Al/AN* women (29.0%) than White[†] women (18.5%).

Birth

August 2017

In 2011-2015, Al/AN* made up an estimated **1.4 percent** of the total births in the state. The average age of Al/AN* mothers at birth was 25.8 years compared to 27.6 for White[†] mothers.

1 in 3 Al/AN* mothers (32.9%) live in rural counties, slightly more than White[†] mothers living in rural counties (29.1%).²

An estimated 32.2% rural AI/AN mothers smoked during pregnancy, compared to 15.9% of rural White mothers.2

2 in 3 Al/AN* mothers (67.1%) live in urban counties, slightly less than White[†] mothers living in urban counties (70.9%).²

An estimated 22.4% urban Al/AN mothers smoked any time during pregnancy, compared to 12.0% of urban White mothers.²

Figure 2. Live Births by Delivery Pay Source, Al/AN Race*, Kansas, 2011-2015²





Figure 3. Teen and Non-Teen Live Births: **Percent Distribution by Trimester Prenatal** Care Began, Al/AN Race*, Kansas, 2011-2015²
