**STATUS OF THE
DRYCLEANER ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE ACT
DECEMBER 1, 2013 - NOVEMBER 30, 2014**

This report fulfills the statutory requirement for a report to the Committees concerning the implementation of the Kansas Drycleaner Environmental Response Act (K.S.A. 1995 Supp. 65-34,141 et seq). As stated in K.S.A.65-34, 154: On or before the first day of the regular legislative session each year, the secretary shall submit to the members of the standing committees on energy and natural resources of the house of representatives and the senate a report regarding a) receipts of the fund during the preceding calendar year and the sources of the receipts; b) disbursements from the fund during the preceding calendar year and the purposes of the disbursements; c) the extent of corrective action taken under this act during the preceding calendar year; and d) the prioritization of sites for expenditures from the fund.

Receipts

The receipts of the fund during the last month of calendar year 2013 and the first 11 months of calendar year 2014 totaled \$948,202.79. Receipts were generated by the environmental surcharge paid by customers at dry cleaning facilities, a solvent fee paid by dry cleaners, a registration fee for dry cleaner facilities, a deductible for dry cleaners that are in the Drycleaner Trust Fund, penalties, and interest on the balance in the fund (see Table 1).

Disbursements

The fund disbursed \$2,094,079.44 (see Table 2).

Corrective Actions

In 2014, KDHE began the year by resuming ongoing corrective action activities at dry cleaning facilities in 29 cities throughout the state. Actions were taken or continued in Atchison, Colby, Concordia, Council Grove, Derby, Downs, Emporia, Garden City, Goodland, Hays, Hesston, Hugoton, Hutchinson, Independence, Junction City, La Crosse, Lawrence, Liberal, Manhattan, McPherson, Mission, Neodesha, Newton, Overland Park, Salina, Smith Center, Topeka, Wamego, and Wichita. A variety of actions were performed including soil and groundwater investigation/monitoring, soil gas surveys, and the continued operation of treatment systems to address soil and groundwater contamination. On March 24, 2014, a new site was referred to the Program which required emergency response to identify and provide alternative drinking water sources to impacted residences. The emergency response necessitated stopping all but one corrective actions across the state in order to focus staff and finances towards providing safe drinking water for the residents. A summary of some of these actions are provided below.

Four dry cleaning facilities in **Derby** are being addressed as sources of three separate groundwater plumes. The EZ Laundry & Ray's Cleaners contamination has been assessed and is in long-term groundwater monitoring program. The implementation of the remedial design for the Van's Cleaners site was completed in late 2010, early 2011 and included the excavation and removal of impacted source soil from the interior of the building. Prior to backfilling the excavation, a chemical oxidation delivery system was placed in the excavation to remediate residual impacts. The introduction of chemical oxidants and groundwater monitoring continues at the site. Groundwater monitoring is on-going at the One-Hour Martinizing site with a remedial design pending. Two sites (Best Cleaners and Lee's Cleaners) were assigned "Closed" status in 2012.

Downs has two public water supply (PWS) wells historically impacted by a dry cleaner. KDHE completed a comprehensive assessment of the groundwater contamination and a large soil removal in the source area. KDHE is monitoring the site's groundwater contamination. A groundwater remediation system has been installed at the city's water treatment plant to allow treatment of contaminated water from the PWS wells.

Assessments have been completed at four facilities (Clothes Cleaners, Four Seasons, and Spic N Span - W. 4th, and Spic N Span - Commercial) in **Emporia**. A vadose zone chemical oxidation project was implemented at the Four Season's facility in 2009 and is being monitored to determine the effect of the remediation. Source soil excavation and removal activities below the facility sanitary sewer were performed at the Clothes Cleaners site in 2010. Prior to backfilling the excavation, a chemical oxidation delivery system was placed in the excavation to

remediate residual impacts. The introduction of chemical oxidants continues at the site. A source investigation was also completed at the W. 4th facility in 2012 to characterize the distribution of soil impact at the site. Groundwater sampling was performed at all four sites to verify the results of the remedial activities.

In **Garden City**, KDHE installed two groundwater remedial systems and one soil remediation system at the Garden City Laundry site. One groundwater remedial system was installed to prevent the migration of contaminants towards a public water well. The other two were installed to reduce the amount of contaminants in the source area. The systems were successful and have been decommissioned. Due to extended drought conditions and groundwater withdrawals in the area, the water levels at the site have dropped below the base of the monitoring wells. As a result, deeper replacement monitoring wells are planned for the site. The site will then continue in long-term monitoring. The Penney/Strohs - Main St. facility was assigned a “Closed” status in 2006.

There are three public water wells threatened by dry cleaning contaminants in **Goodland**. A remediation system installed at Model Steam Laundry continues to operate to remediate the source area. Groundwater monitoring will also continue at the Wardrobe and KAM sites to measure any changes. The City of Goodland completed the construction of a nitrate treatment facility in 2011 that incorporates mixing groundwater obtained from all City wells.

The City of **Hays** had three public water supply wells historically impacted by dry cleaning facilities. KDHE and the City entered into a consent order to design and build a groundwater treatment system to remediate groundwater used at the Hays water treatment plant. The system is successfully treating the water to meet drinking water standards. A soil and groundwater remediation system at the dry cleaning source area operated for seven years and removed a large portion of the contamination. An additional groundwater recovery well was installed to control the migration of contaminated groundwater. The sites are being monitored to evaluate the contaminant levels.

Groundwater monitoring well installation activities were completed in 2010 at the Bennett’s Laundry facility in **Hesston**. These activities supplement the expanded site assessment activities completed in 2009. Monitoring events have been completed at the site to obtain data necessary to evaluate the status of the contamination plume.

Contamination from dry cleaners has historically affected two public water supply wells in **Hutchinson**. There are, or previously have been four distinct dry cleaning contamination plumes within the city. KDHE installed five small groundwater and/or soil remediation systems at the facilities. KDHE also installed a large groundwater remedial system for hydraulic containment of the southernmost plume. The groundwater remedial system has been operational since September 2007. Three source areas have been remediated and are in long-term monitoring. The Saylor Cleaners facility was assigned a “Closed” status in 2006. Two additional sites (One-Hour Martinizing and American Uniform) were assigned “Closed” status in 2012.

Significant groundwater impacts were discovered during soil and groundwater characterizations activities in 2011 at the Verdigris Laundry in **Independence**. Additional assessment activities to further delineate the extent and exposure pathways were performed in 2012 to assist in the development of corrective actions for this site. Monitoring events are continuing at the site to obtain data for developing a plan for corrective measures.

Assessment activities have been completed and a remediation system was installed and is operating at Fashion Cleaners in **Junction City**. The distribution of contaminant throughout the aquifer was investigated and augmentation of the system to include air sparging was completed in 2012, based upon the investigation results. Monitoring of the remediation system has shown effective removal of contaminants from the subsurface.

Expanded Site Assessment activities were completed in 2011 at the Scotch Cleaners facility in **Lawrence**. The activities included characterizing the extent of soil and groundwater impacts at and near the site. Source investigation and monitoring well installation activities were performed in 2012. Groundwater monitoring of the site

is ongoing to provide data to develop a plan for corrective action.

Two public water supply wells in **Manhattan** have been impacted by two dry cleaning facilities. The assessments of these sites and final report have been completed. A large-scale bioremediation project was implemented in 2009 at the two dry cleaning sites in the Aggieville District. This bioremediation augmentation has significantly reduced groundwater contaminant concentrations and continues to be effective at the sites. Groundwater monitoring is on-going to determine the effective lifespan of the bioremediation augmentation and determine the timing of the next augmentation. The Coin-O-Matic site was assigned a “Closed” status in 2012.

Remediation utilizing soil vapor extraction systems continued in **McPherson** at the Giant Wash and Tidy Laundry facilities in 2012. Groundwater monitoring is also being performed to ascertain the effectiveness of the remedial systems. Expanded Site Assessment activities were started in 2012 at the McPherson Laundry and Dry Cleaning site to delineate the extent of contamination.

Releases from a dry cleaning facility in **Neodesha** have contaminated soil and groundwater. KDHE completed an assessment of the site and a pump and treat groundwater remedial system is successfully containing the plume and treating the extracted water. A soil excavation project was completed in 2009. Excavation included removal of portions of the building and utilities. Groundwater monitoring is on-going to determine the effectiveness of the source removal activities.

Source soil removal activities were performed at the former Best Cleaners site in **Newton** in 2011. Approximately 337 tons of soil were excavated and disposed as part of these activities. Prior to backfilling the excavation, a chemical oxidation delivery system was placed in the excavation to remediate residual impacts. The introduction of chemical oxidants continues at the site. Groundwater monitoring is also continuing at the site to determine the effectiveness of the source removal remediation and oxidant introduction on groundwater quality.

Expedited source soil removal activities were performed in **Overland Park** at the former Pride Cleaners site at 8601 W. 95th in 2012 to assist with a property transaction and redevelopment. The source soil was characterized and removed within a time frame that allowed the property redevelopment to continue unimpeded.

Salina has seven public water supply wells historically impacted by dry cleaning facilities. Five separate contamination plumes have been defined. KDHE entered into a Consent Order with the City to design and install a groundwater remediation system at the Salina water treatment plant. The system is successfully treating the water to achieve drinking water standards. The KDHE Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund combined with the Drycleaner Trust Fund to address these sites because gasoline service stations also contributed to the contamination. The Drycleaner Trust Fund has installed five soil remediation systems in the dry cleaning source areas. The systems were shut down after successfully cleaning up the sites. The Drycleaner Trust Fund has also completed a large soil excavation project at one of the source areas. Groundwater and system monitoring are on-going. The Southgate site was assigned a “Closed” status in 2006.

Source soil excavation and removal activities using a large diameter auger and the installation of air sparge and soil vapor extraction remediation system were completed in 2010 at Scotch Cleaners in **Topeka**. The remedial system continued to operate at the site and groundwater is being monitored to determine the results of the remediation efforts.

A Supplemental Source Assessment was completed in **Wamego** in cooperation with the Remedial Section of BER to further delineate the contaminant plume. Assessment activities included the installation of 12 additional monitoring wells and collection of direct push soil & groundwater samples. The Drycleaner Program is providing two, 10,000-pound carbon vessels as an in-kind contribution to be utilized by the City of Wamego to treat a public water supply well impacted by contamination including others sources comingled with Drycleaner contamination.

Wichita has 45 dry cleaning sites in the Drycleaner Program with 23 sites that are being actively addressed by the Trust Fund. Several soil vapor extraction systems, some also including an air sparging component have been installed across the City with ongoing groundwater monitoring to determine the effectiveness of the remedial activities. Assessment activities at one of the 19th and Grove sites were also completed in 2013. Assessment activities in 2014 included source investigations, soil sample collection, and monitoring well installations.

KDHE entered into a consent agreement with the City for two dry cleaning facilities (Apparel Master and Best Cleaners) in the Gilbert and Mosley Site. The Trust Fund is reimbursing the city its proportional costs for the two dry cleaning facilities in the regional groundwater treatment system. The Trust Fund was also responsible for installing source area treatment systems at the two facilities. The Apparel Master system is operational and groundwater monitoring is continuing.

The Trust Fund has completed an assessment at the Lee's Cleaners/Dutchmaid sites and delineated the groundwater plume. KDHE reimbursed the City of Wichita for the installation of a public drinking water line and the connection of impacted residents to the public drinking water system. Vapor mitigation systems were installed in the strip mall and three neighboring triplex housing units. In November 2013, a fire occurred at the facility and the Drycleaner Program used the opportunity to complete additional remedial activities before repairs were completed to the facility. In February 2014, 131 tons of contaminated soil were excavated from within the Lee's Cleaners facility and transported off-site for disposal. Remedial piping to be utilized for future activities was installed, the excavation was backfilled with granular material and the concrete restored so final repairs from the fire damage could be completed by the property owner.

Discount Cleaners and Jim Morgan's Fine Cleaning are separate sites where KDHE identified evidence of private domestic wells within the contamination plume. KDHE connected several residents with domestic wells in the area to the City's public water supply system. Residents with impacted wells were provided bottled water until the hookup was completed. Assessments have been completed at both facilities. A remedial system is operating at Jim Morgan's Fine Cleaning. An air sparge and soil vapor extraction remedial system was installed at the Discount Cleaners site in 2010 and removed in 2013 after successful removal of source area contamination.

Prestige Cleaners - N. Woodlawn and Best Cleaners - E. 21st are being monitored to determine if additional corrective actions are necessary for each site. Additional monitoring wells were installed at the site in 2010 and identified higher groundwater impacts than had been observed previously. Groundwater monitoring continues and a source investigation is pending.

On March 24, 2014, the former Four Seasons Cleaners at 8947 W. Central Avenue was identified as the source for groundwater contamination impacting numerous domestic drinking water wells in west Wichita. KDHE initiated emergency actions to collect samples from residences identified within the Area of Concern and provide alternative drinking water sources to impacted residents. KDHE compared the analytical results from domestic well sampling to the EPA MCL and the EPA Removal Management Level (RML) concentrations to determine immediate risk to the residents. Domestic wells with sample results greater than the RMLs were equipped with a point-of-entry whole-house carbon treatment system as a short-term measure to reduce the risk of exposure to contaminated water from bathing, inhalation and/or ingestion. Residences with domestic well sample results greater than the MCL but less than the RML were provided with bottled drinking water to be used for drinking and cooking. KDHE also began discussions with the City of Wichita for the Design-Build installation of new water mains and connection of impacted residences to the municipal water supply system. Over 2 miles of water line were installed and residences within the area of concern were connected to the City of Wichita Public Water Supply System. Nested sets of monitoring wells were installed along the periphery of the Area of Concern to monitor for plume migration after the private wells were taken offline. KDHE collected water samples from 222 residences. Based on the analytical results for the samples collected, bottled drinking water was provided to 69 residences and point-of-entry carbon systems were installed on 17 residences. KDHE connected 197 residences identified within the area of concern to

the city water supply system. To date, the cost of the emergency action has been \$2,543,194.79.

Prioritization

KDHE uses a ranking program to prioritize the sites in the program. The ranking program takes into account contamination concentration, plume size, proximity to receptors (public drinking water wells, streams, etc.) and other factors. The program then scores the threat to human health and the environment. The list of sites is attached as Table 3.

Development of Regulations

KDHE finalized the writing, review, and public hearing for the regulations and regulatory impact statement during calendar year 1996. A Public Hearing was held and the secretary adopted the regulations. The regulations for the Dry cleaning Environmental Response Act became effective on January 3, 1997. A small regulatory change was made in 1998 allowing additional flexibility for the evaporation of separator water.

Senate Bill 132 was introduced during the 1999 legislative session. The bill revised several aspects of the Dry cleaning Environmental Response Act. The bill was approved by the legislature and governor and became effective on July 1, 1999. Regulation changes were required with this law change. The regulation changes have been completed and became effective on December 22, 2000.
