



Cathode Ray Tube Initiative

NEW FINANCIAL AID PROGRAM FOR COUNTIES, CITIES, AND REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ENTITIES

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment's (KDHE) Bureau of Waste Management is pleased to announce a new initiative designed to foster increased collection of electronic waste, specifically Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) and help offset the associated costs experienced by local governments to properly dispose of this electronic waste category.*

KDHE will reimburse costs to recycle cathode ray tubes that have been collected by cities, counties, or regional solid waste management entities.

- This program does not allow reimbursement for business or out of state waste or for flat video screens
- If your application is accepted, a four month contract will be issued. Shipment and billing must be complete before the contract expires
- Pre-approved reimbursements will be processed upon receipt, when submitted on the one page KDHE form along with receipts from the approved recycling company.
- Claimants must use a KDHE Bureau of Waste Management permitted electronics waste processor or other recycling facility pre-approved by BWM to receive reimbursement.
- To receive reimbursement, a county, city, or regional solid waste management entity must provide written certification that the waste CRTs were only accumulated from Kansas residents, Kansas schools, or Kansas government offices and not from businesses.
- CRTs must be accumulated in a protected location point on pallets or in Gaylord boxes. Necessary steps should be taken to control mosquitoes and other disease vectors.

* This program is being carried out under the authority granted to KDHE under K.S.A. 65-3415a. Reimbursement based upon availability of program funding and may be terminated at any time with 60 days notice.
