Subject Conversation with AnnieLaurie 3/10/06

Randy:

AnnieLaurie called me Friday afternoon with some questions.

KNC wants to do work above and beyond what is approved in the FSP. They have found at SWMU 19 (Trench) that there are other things on the surface and they want to make sure of what those things are, so they are proposing additional sampling.

Also, KNC wants to do additional geophysical methods because of the clays in some of the areas. They are not sure that the EM and GPR will get them the answers they need.

KNC also wants to do some additional sampling around SWMUs 1 & 2. They found a drainage area from Praxair to the North Pond. KNC is afraid that the North/Sound Ponds received drainage/waste from Praxair. AnnieLaurie thinks Praxair also used a chromic acid solution, so she thinks some of this may have gotten into the ponds. They want to do additional sampling.

I told her I was okay with the concept of doing additional work, but I would have to check the permit to see if they would need to submit something in writing, then I would probably have to send them something approving the additional work.

Another issue: Mr. Crane is denying access to the seven (7) monitoring wells on his property. He is upset because Farmland never paid his Dad or him any money to install the wells and sample all of those years. He wants 10 million for access to his property. KNC thinks this is unreasonable. They have offered him the same deal as Mr. Maxwell to the South which is a 10 year lease, and they pay him fair market value for his land, but he get to keep his land, and in exchange, KNC get to sample the wells and have access. AnnieLaurie wanted to know if there was anything we could do, or advice. I told her Crane had spoken to me about this issue at one of the Public Meetings, and I had told him I could not get involved, that this was between him and KNC.

I told her I did understand KNC predicament, because it is in the Permit that it has to sample those wells on a quarterly basis. I told her I would ask around and see if anyone had a similar situation and how it was resolved and that I would talk to our attorney.
