Tarkio CD Disposal, LLC
Application for New Construction Demolition Landfill**

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has received an application from Tarkio CD Disposal, LLC, for a new construction and demolition landfill located at East 56th Avenue, Zeandale, in Riley County, Kansas. The proposed landfill has a total area of 29.9 acres, 25.7 acres of disposal area, and a total capacity of 1,203,000 cubic yards. The facility is located in the northeast quarter of Section 33, Township 10 South, Range 9 East in Riley County, approximately 1.5 mile south of the Zeandale community.

Riley County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with their solid waste management plan and compatible with surrounding land use. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with the state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is today providing public notice of their intent to issue a permit to Tarkio CD Disposal, LLC to operate the proposed C&D landfill described herein. However, a final decision to issue the permit has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. A copy of the administrative record which includes the permit application, engineering drawings, draft permit, and other information with respect to this permit action will be available for public review from September 19, 2013 through October 19, 2013, during normal business hours at the following locations:

Anyone wishing to comment on the proposed facility should submit written statements by 5:00 PM on October 19, 2013, to Habib Ghali of KDHE at the address listed above, or via facsimile to (785) 296-1592, or via e-mail to hghali@kdheks.gov. Comments that are postmarked by – October 19, 2013, and received within one week thereafter will also be considered.

After consideration of all formal comments as described above, KDHE will make a final decision on whether to issue the permit. Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, anyone who submitted formal comments, and those who requested notice of the final permit decision.
