Permit Modification of Tire Town Tire Monofill, Permit No. 360

Topeka, Kansas --- The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) received an application from the Tire Town, Inc. to modify their tire monofill located at 19413 High Prairie Rd. west of Leavenworth in Leavenworth County.

The applicant proposes an increase in total facility permitted area from 285 acres to approximately 308 acres, and an increase in disposal area from 51 acres to around 69 acres. The land elevations after placement of waste tires, and after final cover is proposed to be similar to existing elevations.

Leavenworth County has certified that the application described herein is consistent with their solid waste management plan and compatible with surrounding land use.

KDHE is providing public notice of their intent to issue a permit to Tire Town, Inc. to allow the facility modifications described herein. However, a final decision to issue the permit has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. A copy of the permit application, engineering drawings and draft permit with respect to this permit action will be available for public review at www.kdheks.gov/waste from September 15, 2016 through October 14, 2016, and during normal business hours at the following locations:

Anyone wishing to comment on the proposed facility should submit a written statement by 5:00 PM on October 14, 2016 to Heather Weed of KDHE at the address listed above, or via facsimile to (785) 296-1592, or via e-mail to hweed@kdheks.gov. Comments that are postmarked by October 14, 2016 and received within one week thereafter will also be considered.

After consideration of all formal comments as described above, KDHE will make a final decision on whether to amend the permit. Notice of the decision will be given to the applicant, anyone who submitted formal comments, and those who requested notice of the final permit decision.
