## Thursday, April 7, 2016

### 7:30 to 8:15 am

**Breakfast Discussion - KS Solid Waste Management Plan.** As the Kansas Department of Health and Environment updates its Solid Waste Management Plan, feedback from the industry is important. This is an opportunity to hear about the plan, provide input, answer and ask questions with KDHE Bureau of Waste Management officials.

### 8:15 to 9:15 am - Breakout #1

**Recycling Markets/Prices.** Finding markets for materials is complicated and constantly changing. This session provides information on what resources you can use to find prices, how to evaluate buyers, explains why the market changes and what causes changes, examines the future of various markets and will provide information specific to Kansas.

**Composting Roundtable.** Roundtables provide a unique opportunity to meet with others in the field and discuss issues that matter to you. Moderated by KDHE Bureau of Waste Management.

**What a Pest! HHW Pesticide Collection.** Pesticides are a continual part of the HHW stream from commercial businesses and households. They present a unique set of challenges when it comes to collection, storage and disposing. This session discusses those issues along with regulations.

### 9:45 to 10:45 am - Breakout #2

**Recycling Sensitive Data: Disposal & Legal Responsibilities.** Recycling facilities are constantly collecting data in recycling streams that contain sensitive information, whether it be in paper or electronic form. There are best practices to follow when disposing of this data and legal responsibilities you have. This session addresses best practices and legal responsibilities of removing this data.

**Regional Differences/Statewide Challenges in Composting.** Depending on where you compost materials, what you are collecting in your region is different than materials being collected in another region. Yet, you face similar challenges. This session examines differences in material collection throughout Kansas, while addressing the differences and similarities areas face in handling, disposing and finding end users and buyers for those materials.

**Composting Breakout: Feedstock: A Growing Industry.** Feedstock to compost is a growing industry, particularly in Western Kansas. With it comes unique opportunities and challenges. This session examines this growing industry, discusses its impact on feedlots and communities and presents opportunities and challenges of handling feedstock as compost.

**HHW Breakout: Inspections 101.** Inspections are a necessity and challenging for all involved, from regulators to those at the inspection site. For those new to the process, this is an opportunity to learn the who, what, when, hows and much more of the inspection process. For those who have been in the industry for many years, this is an opportunity to revisit the process and speak with inspectors one-on-one.
