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# WORKING GROUP SESSION

- By end of June meeting, goal is for groups to have 1-4 recommendations to present to Child Care Licensing.
- Recommendations should describe need and rationale (something we know is happening across the system)
- While recommendations should be clear and supported, they do need to describe specifics of implementation.
- Not all ideas are expected to become recommendations. There will be an opportunity to revisit in later meetings.
